Current Schedule

MWF - 329 instructional minutes (+5 HR) for students, 235 for teachers

TH - 328 instructional minutes (+8 HR) for students including I/E, 246 for teachers

41/47 minute periods and lunches

32/36 minutes of passing time

47.8 hours of I/E

6:53 full day

7 courses per year - students

5 courses per year - teachers

Block Schedule

340 instructional minutes/day (+5 HR) for students including I/E, 261 for teachers (231 without I/E)

77 minute blocks (79 4th Block)

35 or 39 minute lunches

30 minute daily I/E

28 minutes of passing time

87 hours of I/E per year

6:48 full day

8 courses per year - students

6 courses per year - teachers

Benefits of a Block Schedule - Students

Less courses to focus on in a day

Homework for fewer classes per day

Increased instructional time

Room for one additional class per year

Ability to accelerate ("double-up")

More time to dedicate to math in 9th grade

More than double the time for intervention/enrichment

Time for labs and high-level learning activities

Benefits of a Block Schedule - Teachers

Fewer classes per day to plan

Less grading on a daily basis

More opportunity for in-depth instruction

Time for science labs and other hands-on activities

More time to work with students in I/E

Less time in the cafeteria

New classes in January allow for a fresh start

Half days allow for 40 minutes of instruction per class
