- A completed Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Plan from your health care provider with instructions the school is to follow in the event your child experiences an allergic reaction while at school.
- 3) Please sign the parent/guardian permission section at the bottom of the **Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Plan** and complete the back page of the form.
- 4) If your child will be carrying medication (i.e. an EpiPen, Auvi-Q, or generic epinephrine auto injector) to self-administer in the event of an allergic reaction, please have your health care provider check the appropriate box on the **Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Plan.**
- 5) Parent/guardian are to provide Epinephrine (such as an EpiPen, Auvi-Q, or generic epinephrine auto injector), or other medications, such as Benadryl, if necessary, for treatment of an allergic reaction.

Your prompt attention to the above matter is essential if we are to safely care for your child while at school. *Please provide the above information to the school nurse by the first week of school.* If you have any questions, feel free to contact your child's school nurse.

For Severe Allergy and Anaphylaxis What to look for	Give epinephrine! What to do	
If child has ANY of these severe symptoms after eating the food or having a sting, give epinephrine.  Shortness of breath, wheezing, or coughing Skin color is pale or has a bluish color Weak pulse Fainting or dizziness Tight or hoarse throat Trouble breathing or swallowing Swelling of lips or tongue that bother breathing Vomiting or diarrhea (if severe or combined with other symptoms) Many hives or redness over body Feeling of "doom," confusion, alfered consciousness, or agitation  SPECIAL SITUATION: If this box is checked, child has an extremely severe allergy to an insect sting or the following food(s): Even if child has MILD symptoms after a sting or eating these foods, give epinephrine.	1. Inject epinephrine right away! Note time when epinephrine.  2. Call 911.  3. Stay with child and:  4. Call parents and child's doctor.  5. Call parents and child's doctor.  6.
